STEPS OF THE BISHOP OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Steps of the Bishop of the Holy Spirit have been named after the first-known Bishop of Zagreb in 2006, following a proposal submitted by the Croatian-Czech Society. The charter of Archbishop Felician of 1134 revealed that, at the end of the 11th Century, the Hungarian King Ladislaus founded the Zagreb Diocese to dissuade the locals from superstition and appointed a Czech named Duh (Holy Spirit) as the first Bishop. These Steps lead to Tkalčićeva Street via a passage that was opened in the Kaptol ramparts that is visible from the Park. These ramparts were built at the end of the 15th Century to protect the Kaptol from possible attacks by the Ottomans.
