

Felbinger's Steps, along with the Mala (Small), Mlinska (Millers') and Kožarska (Tanners') Steps, are steps that lead up to the Upper Town. At one point these Steps were known as 'sto starih štengi' ('One Hundred Old Steps') and got their current name after Bartol Felbinger, one of the most widely known builders of public and private buildings in Zagreb during the first half of the 19th Century. These steps lead steeply to the Radićeva Street, so a certain amount of effort is required to reach the top.

Take the steps and count as you climb, so you can see if the old inhabitants of Zagreb were right to call these Steps 'sto starih štengi' ('One Hundred Old Steps'). A new sign with a QR code awaits you on Radićeva Street.
